A Study of the Book of Daniel Daniel's Final Climax

Chapter 11

Chapter 11 provides an outline, an overview of a vast sweep of prophecy. Here Gabriel gives to Daniel a detailed history from the time of Darius the Mede, through the time of Christ's crucifixion in Daniel 11:22, and covering events during the time of the end. This is a repeat and enlargement of the prophecies that we have already looked at from Daniel chapters 2, 7, and 8.

The Medo-Persian Empire

Daniel 11:1, 2 (Arms & Chest of Silver-Daniel 2 / Bear -Daniel 7 / Ram -Daniel 8) "Also I in the first year of Darius the Mede, even I, stood to confirm and to strengthen him. And now will I shew thee the truth. Behold, there shall stand up yet three kings in Persia; and the fourth shall be far richer than they all: and by his strength through his riches he shall <u>stir up all against the realm of</u> <u>Grecia.</u>"

Darius the Mede was mentioned as the initial ruler in Medo-Persia. However, Gabriel informs Daniel that there will be three more kings in Persia, followed by a fourth who will be far richer and will "*stir up all against the realm of Grecia.*"

King Cyrus was reigning at the time of the vision. History tells us the next two kings of Persia were **Cambyses II** (530-522 BC), and **Darius I** (522-486 BC). Cyrus and Darius I issued the first two decrees to rebuild the Temple. The third king, was **Xerxes** (486-465 BC) known in the Bible as Ahasuerus, the husband of Queen Esther. The fourth king, was **Artaxerxes I** (465-425 BC), which gave the final decree to restore Jerusalem.

The beginning of the Grecian Empire

Daniel 11:3, 4 (Belly & Thighs of Brass-Daniel 2 / Leopard -Daniel 7 / He-Goat -Daniel 8) "And <u>a mighty king shall stand up</u>, that shall rule with great dominion, and do according to his will. And when he shall stand up, <u>his kingdom shall be broken</u>, and shall **be divided toward four winds** of heaven; and <u>not to his posterity</u>, nor according to his dominion which he ruled: for his kingdom shall be plucked up, even for others beside those."

Next, the "*mighty king*" that arose was Alexander the Great of Greece. He led Greece to world supremacy the quickest of any kingdom, paralleled by the Leopard with four wings from Daniel chapter 7. At the age of 32, Alexander the Great got sick with a fever, after a drinking binge, and died in June of 323 B.C. After the death of Alexander, there was civil unrest for the next twenty years, as there was a power struggle to gain control of his kingdom. Finally, in 301 B.C. After the battle of Ipsus, the territory was divided up into four parts, in which his four generals, Cassander, Lysimachus, Ptolemy, and Seleucus, ruled in his place. Thus, Alexander's kingdom was given to "others" who were not of "his posterity."

Key Point:

Cassander controlled Macedonia and Greece, **Lysimachus** controlled eastward to Thrace and Asia Minor, **Seleucus** founded the Seleucid Empire that controlled the area of old Syria eastward to the Indus River, and **Ptolemy** founded the Ptolemaic Empire of Egypt.

The Division of the Grecian Empire by Alexander's four generals

Daniel 11:5

"And the <u>king of the south</u> shall be strong, and <u>one of his princes</u>; and he shall be strong above him, and have dominion; his dominion shall be a great dominion."

The terms "King of the North" and "King of the South" appear frequently in Daniel 11. They designate those

countries or kingdoms which were physically located to the north or south of Palestine, the dwelling place of God's people. Here the angel portrays God's people caught between the great struggles of opposing powers that Satan would manipulate for his own ends. In verse 5, Ptolemy I Soter (323-280 BC) was strong right from the start. The prince who would become stronger was Seleucus I Nictator, who was driven out of the north by Antigonus I Monophthalmus, who founded the Macedonian <u>dynasty</u> of the <u>Antigonids</u> (306–168 BC), becoming <u>king</u> in 306. Antigonus was one of Alexander's former generals that controlled Syria. He was trying to reunite Alexanders kingdom, but, Ptolemy, Cassander, Lysimachus, and Seleucus allied together against him. Seleucus I Nictator fled to Egypt where he was helped by Ptolemy I Soter. Outfitted with another army from Ptolemy, Seleucus eventually retook the Seleucid empire. This made him the "King of the North" and master of most of Alexander's original empire.

Daniel 11:6

"And in the end of years they shall join themselves together; for the king's daughter of the south shall come to the king of the north to make an agreement: but she shall not retain the power of the arm; neither shall he stand, nor his arm: but she shall be given up, and they that brought her, and he that begat her, and he that strengthened her in these times."

Around 250 BC, King Ptolemy II Philadelphus of Egypt (King of the South) and King Antiochus II Theos of Syria (King of the North) attempted to guarantee peace via a marriage between King Antiochus II and the daughter (Bernice) of Ptolemy II. In order to form this new marriage, Antiochus II divorced his existing wife Laodice. Antiochus II and Bernice had a baby boy, but when Ptolemy II died, Antiochus divorced Bernice and took back Laodice. In spite of getting her husband back, Laodice was bitter. She had Antiochus II, Bernice, their son, and Bernice's attendants murdered, fulfilling what the angel had told Daniel some 300 years in advance.

Daniel 11:7-9

"But out of a branch of her roots shall one stand up in his estate, which shall come with an army, and shall enter into the fortress of the king of the north, and shall deal against them, and shall prevail: And shall also carry captives into Egypt their gods, with their princes, and with their precious vessels of silver and of gold; and he shall continue more years than the king of the north. So the king of the south shall come into his kingdom, and shall return into his own land."

King Ptolemy III (246-221 BC), Bernice's brother, invaded Syria to avenge his sister's death. He took his army all the way to Babylon and beyond before voluntarily pulling back. His navy occupied Seleucia, the port that served Antioch, the capital of Syria. For some time, Egypt dominated Eastern Mediterranean shipping. Winning this campaign, Ptolemy III captured 2,500 gold and silver images and took them back as the spoils of war from his campaign.

Daniel 11:10-12

"But his sons [the two sons of Seleucus II] shall be stirred up, and shall assemble a multitude of great forces: and one shall certainly come, and overflow, and pass through: then shall he return, and be stirred up, even to his fortress. And the king of the south [Ptolemy IV] shall be moved with choler, and shall come forth and fight with him, even with the king of the north [Antiochus III]: and he [Antiochus III] shall set forth a great multitude; but the multitude shall be given into his [Ptolemy's] hand. And when he hath taken away the multitude [the army is defeated], his [Ptolemy's] heart shall be lifted up; and he shall cast down many ten thousands: but he shall not be strengthened by it."

The Ptolemies and Seleucids continued to quarrel. The two sons of Seleucus II (King of the North) namely Seleucus III who was assassinated (225-223 BC) and Antiochus III The Great (223-187 BC) continued to war against Ptolemy (King of the South). In 217, Antiochus III (King of the North) and Ptolemy IV (King of the South) waged a heated battle, the Battle of Raphia, with about 70,000 foot soldiers and 5,000 cavalry including

180 trained war elephants. Antiochus had a significant numerical advantage, but lost the battle. Antiochus III, after his defeat in 217, went back and raised another army to attack the Ptolymiac Empire.

Daniel 11:13,14a:

"For the king of the north [Antiochus III] shall again raise a multitude, greater than the former; and after some years he shall come on with a great army and abundant supplies. In those times many shall rise against the king of the south."

By the time he prepared for this new attack, Ptolemy IV, a boy of 6 years, sat on the throne as "King of the South." Great civil unrest in Egypt and open rebellion broke out against the Greek overlords of the Ptolemiac Dynasty.

Beginning of the Roman Empire

Daniel 11:14b, 15 (Legs of Iron-Daniel 2 / Non-Descript Beast -Daniel 7 / Little Horn -Daniel 8) "Also the robbers of thy people shall exalt themselves <u>to establish the vision</u>; but they shall fall. So the king of the north [Antiochus III] shall come, and cast up a mount, and take the most fenced cities: and the arms of the south shall not withstand, neither his chosen people, neither [shall there be any] strength to withstand."

The "*robbers of thy people*" literally means "the breakers of thy people." "*Establish the vision*" refers to Rome. Remember the vision of Daniel 2: Rome, the Iron Monarchy, would break in pieces and subdue all things (Dan. 2:40). Rome, the fourth beast with iron teeth would arise after the Grecian Empire (Dan. 7:7). In the days of Antiochus III, Rome entered the historical picture of the Eastern Mediterranean area. The Romans warned Antiochus III to stay out of Egypt, but he made an alliance with Philip of Macedon and went against Ptolemy V of Egypt, ignoring Rome's threat. Antiochus III defeated the King of the South's general in a final battle by taking the fortified city of Tyre. Never again did Egypt hold control over Palestine. Between 223-221 BC, the Greco-Macedonian empire expanded geographically, reaching the original size of the Grecian Empire under Alexander the Great.

Daniel 11:16

"But he that cometh against him shall do according to his own will, and none shall stand before him: and he shall stand in the glorious land, which by his hand shall be consumed."

In response to the attack on Egypt, the Roman general Pompey conquered "*the glorious land*" of Palestine. With Pompey's victories, the Eastern Mediterranean region fell under Roman rule.

Daniel 11:17-19

"He shall also set his face to enter with the strength of his whole kingdom, and upright ones with him; thus shall he do: and he shall give him the daughter of women, corrupting her: but she shall not stand on his side, neither be for him. After this shall he turn his face unto the isles, and shall take many: but a prince for his own behalf shall cause the reproach offered by him to cease; without his own reproach he shall cause it to turn upon him. Then he shall turn his face toward the fort of his own land: but he shall stumble and fall, and not be found.

These verses portray the period of Julius Caesar and his affair with "**the daughter of women**," Queen Cleopatra of Egypt. They also suggest his later exploits in frontier areas of "**the coastlands**." Julius Caesar was insufferably insolent military butcher who attempted to replace the government of the Roman Republic with a personal dictatorship. Verse 19 refers to his assassination in 44 BC at the hands of fellow Romans as led by G. Cassius Longinus.

Daniel 11:20

"*Then shall stand up in his estate a <u>raiser of taxes</u> in the glory of the kingdom: but <u>within few days he</u> shall be destroyed, neither in anger, nor in battle."*

The rule of Julius Caesar was followed by Caesar Augustus whom Daniel's prophecy describes as a **"raiser of taxes."**

Luke 2:1-3

"And it came to pass in those days, that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus, that all the world should be taxed. (And this taxing was first made when Cyrenius was governor of Syria.) And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city."

Caesar Augustus established the "*Pax Romana*," Latin for Roman Peace, that was established in 27 B.C. and ran for 206 years, until 180 A.D. This was a time of when Rome was at rest and grew to approximately 70 million people. Caesar Augustus died of old age, not in battle.

Daniel 11:21

"And in his estate shall stand up a vile person, to whom they shall not give the honour of the kingdom: but he shall come in peaceably, and obtain the kingdom by flatteries."

After Augustus Caesar came Tiberius Caesar. This pedophile, **"a vile person,"** was an adopted son of Augustus Caesar who manipulated his way to the throne. He was in power when Jesus was baptized and when Jesus was crucified. Rome hated him, and he was eventually murdered, and his body was thrown into the Tiber River.

Luke 3:1

"Now in the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate being governor of Judaea, and Herod being tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of Ituraea and of the region of Trachonitis, and Lysanias the tetrarch of Abilene."

This verse leads into the account of the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist. Three and a half years later, during the eighteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, Jesus was crucified on a Roman cross.

Daniel 11:22

"And with the arms of a flood shall they be overflown from before him, and shall be broken; yea, also the prince of the covenant."

"And with the arms of a flood shall they be overflown from before him and shall be broken" Tiberius Caesar was famous for a number of military conquests.

"Yea, also the prince of the covenant" – Jesus was crucified under Tiberius Caesar's reign by Pontius Pilate.

KEY POINT:

The angel revealed prophetically to Daniel many details of the history affecting God's people. Almost five hundred years in advance, the prophecy foretold the time of Christ's baptism and crucifixion (Daniel 9: 70-week prophecy). The predictive outline of Daniel 11 foresaw the emperor under whom Christ's crucifixion would occur – Tiberius Caesar.

Daniel 11:23-30

"And after the league made with him he shall work deceitfully: for he shall come up, and shall become strong with a small people. He shall enter peaceably even upon the fattest places of the province; and he

shall do that which his fathers have not done, nor his fathers' fathers; he shall scatter among them the prey, and spoil, and riches: yea, and he shall forecast his devices against the strong holds, even for a time. And he shall stir up his power and his courage against the king of the south with a great army; and the king of the south shall be stirred up to battle with a very great and mighty army; but he shall not stand: for they shall forecast devices against him. Yea, they that feed of the portion of his meat shall destroy him, and his army shall overflow: and many shall fall down slain. And both these kings' hearts shall be to do mischief, and they shall speak lies at one table; but it shall not prosper: for yet the end shall be at the time appointed. Then shall he return into his land with great riches; and his heart shall be against the holy covenant; and he shall do exploits, and return to his own land. At the time appointed he shall return, and come toward the south; but it shall not be as the former, or as the latter. For the ships of Chittim shall come against him: therefore he shall be grieved, and return, and have indignation against the holy covenant: so shall he do; he shall even return, and have intelligence with them that forsake the holy covenant."

After Tiberius died in 37 AD, Rome continued its war on the Christian church during the first three centuries AD, beginning with Nero and ending with Diocletian. John Foxe, the author of *Foxe's Book of Martyrs*, lists ten major campaigns of persecution, the tenth being the worst. During this period, many Christians died for their faith as Christianity was outlawed and considered treason against the Roman Empire. Verse 29 describes the end of the Pagan Roman Empire. In 331 AD, Constantine converted to Christianity and soon left Rome to build up Byzantium, later known as Constantinople, as his new capital. When he left, Constantine put the bishop of Rome in charge of the church and state, paving the way for papal Rome. With incoming Barbarian tribes, the Roman Empire started on a downward spiral.

Daniel 11:31-39. (Little Horn -Daniel 7 / Little Horn -Daniel 8)

"And arms shall stand on his part, and they shall pollute the sanctuary of strength, and shall take <u>away</u> <u>the daily</u> sacrifice, and they shall place the abomination that maketh desolate. And such as do wickedly against the covenant shall he corrupt by flatteries: but the people that do know their God shall be strong, and do exploits. And they that understand among the people shall instruct many: yet they shall fall by the sword, and by flame, by captivity, and by spoil, many days. Now when they shall fall, they shall be holpen with a little help: but many shall cleave to them with flatteries. And some of them of understanding shall fall, to try them, and to purge, and to make them white, even to the time of the end: because it is yet for a time appointed. And the king shall do according to his will; and he shall exalt himself, and magnify himself above every god, and shall speak marvellous things against the God of gods, and shall prosper till the indignation be accomplished: for that that is determined shall be done. Neither shall he regard the God of his fathers, nor the desire of women, nor regard any god: for he shall magnify himself above all. But in his estate shall he honour the God of forces: and a god whom his fathers knew not shall he honour with gold, and silver, and with precious stones, and pleasant things. Thus shall he do in the most strong holds with a strange god, whom he shall acknowledge and increase with glory: and he shall cause them to rule over many, and shall divide the land for gain."

In 496 AD Clovis, King of the Franks, converted to Catholicism. As Clovis conquered the enemies of Rome, they had a choice: become Catholic, leave or die! This led to the rise of the Papal Roman power, when in 538 AD, Clovis finally "*uprooted*" the last of the three horns – the Ostrogoth's. These verses correspond with the first beast of Revelation 13, which takes us down through the Dark Ages of Papal supremacy.

Revelation 13:1-10.

"And I stood upon the sand of the sea, and saw a beast rise up out of the sea, having seven heads and ten horns, and upon his horns ten crowns, and upon his heads the name of blasphemy. And the beast which I saw was like unto a leopard, and his feet were as the feet of a bear, and his mouth as the mouth of a lion: and the dragon gave him his power, and his seat, and great authority. And I saw one of his heads as it were wounded to death; and his deadly wound was healed: and all the world wondered after the beast. And they worshipped the dragon which gave power unto the beast: and **they worshipped the beast**, saying, Who, is like unto the beast? who is able to make war with him? And there was given unto him **a mouth speaking great things and blasphemies**; and power was given unto him to **continue forty and two months.** And he opened his mouth in <u>blasphemy against God</u>, to blaspheme his name, and his tabernacle, and them that dwell in heaven. And it was given unto him to <u>make war with</u> <u>the saints</u>, and to overcome them: and power was given him over all kindreds, and tongues, and nations. And **all that dwell upon the earth shall worship him**, whose names are not written in the book of life of the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world. If any man have an ear, let him hear. He that leadeth into captivity shall go into captivity: he that killeth with the sword must be killed with the sword. Here is the patience and the faith of the saints."

The description of this first beast in Revelation 13 has the same characteristics as the Little Horn from Daniel 7 and 11, which we have already identified as the Roman Catholic Papacy. This power ruled from 538 AD until 1798 AD, which brings us to Daniel 11:40.

Daniel 11:40-43.

"And <u>at the time of the end</u> shall the king of the south push at him: and the king of the north shall come against him like a whirlwind, with chariots, and with horsemen, and with many ships; and he shall enter into the countries, and shall overflow and pass over. <u>He shall enter also into the glorious land</u>, and many countries shall be overthrown: but these shall <u>escape</u> out of his hand, even Edom, and Moab, and the chief of the children of Ammon. He shall stretch forth his hand also upon the countries: and the land of Egypt shall not escape. But he shall have power over the treasures of gold and of silver, and over all the precious things of Egypt: and the Libyans and the Ethiopians shall be at his steps."

Verse 40 begins with "And at the time of the end," which points us to 1798 AD. At the close of the French Revolution, Napoleon sent General Berthier to Rome to stop the political power of the Roman Papacy. As Berthier took Pope Pious VI captive, the papacy received a "deadly wound" (Rev. 13:3), and the pope eventually died in exile.

On February 12, 1929 the San Francisco Chronicle headlines read, "Mussolini and Gasparri sign Historic Roman Pact." The article stated, "The Roman question tonight was a thing of the past and the Vatican was at peace with Italy...in affixing the autographs to the memorable document <u>healing the wound</u>...extreme cordiality was displayed on both sides." With the signing of the Lateran Treaty the previous day, the kingdom of Italy guaranteed the international sovereignty of the Holy See of Rome, giving it absolute and sole jurisdiction over the Vatican State. This territory was merely 110 acres, but it became a sovereign nation, with its own government. Today at least 105 countries have ambassadors to the Vatican, including the United States of America. Since that time the Roman Papacy has pervasively risen in power while influencing politics in every country and ethnic group. They have worked hard to get cooperation with the Islamic and Protestant nations alike. Some will escape Rome's power, symbolized by "Edom, Moab, and Ammon," but "Egypt," symbolizing the atheistic secular societies that prevail today, will not escape the grip of the Little Horn Power. The Papacy has worked to bring down communism and secularism, as they work to control politics for their own gain. The ultimate goal of the Papacy is the union of church and state, enabling the church to control the state.

In the past God used the Ottoman Empire (Islam) to hold the persecution of the Papal Roman Church during the Protestant Reformation (dark ages). The Roman church had to combine all of its forces to fight the Islamic power that was on the rise. The king of the North (Papal Rome) won, but God's Word could no longer be silenced, it spread like wild fire!

God may be using the Islamic power to rise, "*at the time of the end* shall the king of the south push at him," to force Christianity to fight under one banner, with one leader, the Pope! The Bible says that the United States

will be foremost in leading the charge of uniting with and worshiping the Pope.

Daniel 11:44-45.

"<u>But tidings out of the east and out of the north shall trouble him</u>: therefore he shall go forth with great fury to destroy, and utterly to make away many. And he shall plant the tabernacles of his palace between the seas in the glorious holy mountain; yet he shall come to his end, and none shall help him."

"But tidings out of the <u>east</u> and out of the <u>north</u> shall trouble him."

The Papacy responds negatively to the message that Jesus is about to come.

Revelation 7:2-3

"And I saw another angel ascending <u>from the east</u>, having the seal of the living God: and he cried with a loud voice to the four angels, to whom it was given to hurt the earth and the sea, Saying, Hurt not the earth, neither the sea, nor the trees, <u>till we have sealed the servants of our God in their foreheads</u>."

Isaiah 41:25

"The Lord says, "I have raised up one from the <u>north</u>, and he shall come: from the rising of the sun shall he call upon my name." (Isaiah 41:25)

Therefore, "*the tidings*" out of the east and north that trouble the Papacy is the third angels' message and the warning.

Revelation 14:9-11

"If any man worship the beast and his image, and receive his mark in his forehead, or in his hand, <u>The</u> same shall drink of the wine of the wrath of God, which is poured out without mixture into the cup of his indignation; and he shall be tormented with fire and brimstone in the presence of the holy angels, and in the presence of the Lamb: And the smoke of their torment ascendeth up for ever and ever: and they have no rest day nor night, who worship the beast and his image, and whosoever receiveth the mark of his name."

Daniel 11:44

"Therefore he shall go forth with great fury to destroy, and utterly to make away many."

Revelation 13:11-18.

"And I beheld another beast coming up out of the earth; and he had two horns like a lamb, and he spake as a dragon. And he exerciseth all the power of the first beast before him, and causeth the earth and them which dwell therein to worship the first beast, whose deadly wound was healed. And he doeth great wonders, so that he maketh fire come down from heaven on the earth in the sight of men, And deceiveth them that dwell on the earth by the means of those miracles which he had power to do in the sight of the beast; saying to them that dwell on the earth, that they should make an image to the beast, which had the wound by a sword, and did live. And he had power to give life unto the image of the beast, that the image of the beast should both speak, and cause that as many as would not worship the image of the beast should be killed. And he causeth all, both small and great, rich and poor, free and bond, to receive a mark in their right hand, or in their foreheads: And that no man might buy or sell, save he that had the mark, or the name of the beast; or the number of his name. Here is wisdom. Let him that hath understanding count the number of the beast: for it is the number of a man; and his number is Six hundred threescore and six."

The Bible now takes us closer to the second coming by introducing a "Lamb-like Beast" or "Nation" that would rise after the 1,260 years of Papal dominion. Unmistakably this points to only one nation, the United

States of America. This country rose from virgin soil, in an unpopulated area of the world. From its humble beginning, the USA has risen to be the last super power on earth which influences the world physically, morally, and spiritually! Revelation 13 tells us that this "*Lamb-like Beast*" will work hand-in-hand with Papal Rome.

Verse 12 says, "He exerciseth all the power of the first beast [Roman Papacy]."

In order for the United States to exercise all the power of the Papacy, civil and religious liberties will be trampled upon as church and state unite. Thus the USA acts as the "*Enforcer*," causing everyone to "*worship the first beast*" which is the Papacy.

Verse 15 says, "He had power to give life unto the image of the beast, that the image of the beast should both speak, and cause that as many as would not worship the image of the beast <u>should be</u> <u>killed</u>."

The conclusion of the Great Controversy comes to a climax as a death decree is issued for those who refuse to participate in this forced, false worship which pays homage to Papal Rome instead of the God of Heaven. This is the same situation that we saw in Daniel chapter 3, where Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were given the ultimatum, fall down and worship the golden image or die! At the end of time God's true people will be given the ultimatum, worship the image to the first beast (Papal Rome) or die!

The death decree issued by the United States of America leads to decisions. Most will choose to follow and worship the Beast, but God's true believers obediently worship Him alone by His grace. When every choice has been made, the sealing process is finished. Once this is done, probation closes and Jesus stands up, comes out of the heavenly sanctuary, takes off His High Priestly garments, and puts on His crown as King of kings and Lord of lords! Chapter twelve is a continuation of this prophecy.

Daniel 12:1-3

"And at that time shall Michael stand up, the great prince which standeth for the children of thy people: and there shall be a time of trouble, such as never was since there was a nation even to that same time: and at that time thy people shall be delivered, every one that shall be found written in the book. And many of them that sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. And they that be wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament; and they that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever and ever."

When Michael (Jesus Christ) stands up, the judgment is finished. Every case has been decided, and we are forever saved or lost! At this point there is no switching sides, no second chance! Probation is closed! The seven last plagues will fall of the wicked (see Rev. 15 & 16) while God protects His people. Then we will see Jesus coming in the clouds of heaven. Coming to get all of His faithful people and take them back to heaven.

We are living in the very last few verses of Daniel chapter 11, just preceding the close of probation and the second coming of Jesus. There is no time to delay!
